EOSA has a New Legal Structure and New Members

On June 1st, EOSA members signed a new legal structure for its alliance and sealed their future with this important act: With immediate effect, EOSA, the office supplies and business services alliance, will function as a cooperative and have its registered office in Amsterdam. EOSA says that the move is in response to the challenge of Globals and it is now able to act faster and more efficiently as an alliance.

Two new realities are relevant to the membership structure: The Swiss member iba was sold to the Migros Group within the framework of succession planning; therefore, the already existing Migros' subsidiary Office World was picked up as a new EOSA member. A further highlight is that the Dutch company Hedera has joined EOSA. Hedera's owner and director, Philip Becker talks about membership in EOSA: "Admittedly, we are a smaller member. Nevertheless, we see ourselves as a sort of "door opener" which can operate from Holland for EOSA."
